Timolin and Casey Cole, founders of Nat King Cole Generation Hope, invited friends and supporters to a cocktail reception in support of the organization.

The event took place March 30 at Emilio Pucci.

The foundation has donated musical instruments to schools throughout South Florida, with plans to expand nationally in the near future.
